A couple's tier in insurance would make a significant difference for so many people, allowing them to allocate those savings elsewhere in their lives. I want to rally other union representatives on other campuses to push for this change. Together, we can advocate for a more equitable solution.

What about your community engagement; any hobbies?

My wife and I donate everything we can to Project Concern as opposed to throwing it away. During the holidays we go to Boscov's and select items from the tree to donate to those in need. Other than that I just try my best to be a good human, empathy goes a long way.
