 - o Dr. John Locke is a Navy veteran who served from 1980 to 1986 before starting a career in the civilian sector in graphic design and commercial illustration. Having completed his BA in Computer Graphic Design at SUNY Empire State College in 1994, he quickly rose to the rank of art director and then creative director before returning to Empire State to complete a Masters in Liberal Studies in 2003. Locke's career path took a gradual turn from the commercial to the academic realm, first as a part-time mentor at Empire State College, then as adjunct lecturer at Keuka College in central New York. He was hired full time at Keuka, first as program coordinator for the Accelerated Studies for Adults BS in Business program, before accepting a position as Director of Distance Education and Instructional Design. In 2015, Locke took a position as Coordinator of Technology Enhanced Learning at SUNY Plattsburgh, while finishing a doctorate in Interdisciplinary Studies with a focus in Humanities and Culture at Union Institute and University in Cincinnati, Ohio. He successfully defended his dissertation, *Utopia Revisited* in 2018, which included researching, writing, and illustrating a 400-page historical novel of the same title. Locke is a Certified Equity Advocate, and sits on numerous committees at SUNY Plattsburgh, including chair of the Electronic and Information Technology Accessibility Committee, and member of the President's Campus, Community, and Safety Advisory

Committee, the President's Inclusive Excellence Council, the Center for Teaching Excellence Advisory Board, and as a member of the SUNY EIT Accessibility Advisory Group. In addition, he has been teaching as an adjunct lecturer for the Communication Studies department since 2016.
